PARKING LOT SAFETY

During arrival and dismissal times, parents are reminded that when entering the school parking lot, to please use the drop off lane along the fence in the upper parking lot. Only HRCE staff, busses and emergency vehicles are permitted in the lower parking lot beyond the fence. Thank you for your support in keeping everyone safe.

SCHOOL SECURITY

Our school uses a video surveillance system as part of our continued efforts to support a safe, positive and effective learning environment. We recognize that the images recorded by this video surveillance system are personal information and, as with all other personal information, we take steps to balance privacy rights with safety and security concerns. The school has the legal authority to collect this personal information under Section 24 of Nova Scotia's *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.

Only designated staff has access to our video surveillance equipment and such access is restricted as required by law. The system is used to enhance school safety and to deter or take action in response to unlawful behaviors.

FALL WEATHER

The cold weather is arriving! Please make sure that your child is dressed for cold weather. Warm hats, mitts and boots make outdoor play at recess and lunch much more enjoyable.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

Did you know? HRCE takes great care when making the decision to alter the regular operations of schools and school buses in the event of severe or inclement weather. It is HRCE's goal to communicate any changes to the regular operations of schools and/or buses as close to 6:00 a.m. as possible. A 6:00 a.m. announcement could be:

- All schools are delayed in opening by two hours and bus pickups are delayed by two hours; or
- All schools are open, but some or all buses are not operating for the day; or
- Some schools (either individually or by family) are closed for the day; or
- All schools are closed for the day.

If weather deteriorates, or is forecasted to worsen throughout the morning, an 11:00 a.m. announcement could be:

- Bused students will be picked up two hours earlier than their regular dismissal time; and
- Walking students will be dismissed at their regularly scheduled lunch hour.

We ask that you send your child to school with a water bottle as this is the only way students can use the water bottle filling stations. This limits the number of trips needed to the stations throughout the day and reduces the large number of disposable cups that we are consuming on a daily basis. SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL

"School Advisory Councils plays an important role in supporting student success at the school community level. A School Advisory Council is an advisory body to the school principal and the Regional Centre for Education on a range of issues related to the school and the school system. Membership can vary, but generally consists of the school principal, parents, teachers, and other community members" (HRCE Website/SAC) Typically the SAC meets 6 times a year to discuss issues relating to the school, initiatives, funding and student achievement. *In our efforts to have a balanced council representing all students and the geographical areas that feed into our school, we are looking for members to represent Preston Township.* If anyone is interested in volunteering to be a part of the SAC, or would like to learn more about it, please contact the school.
