Ongoing Business:

New Business:

A. Student Success Plan / Early Development Instrument survey (EDI) Last year's primary students participated in the EDI for teachers to determine areas of vulnerability. This information is collected by the EECD to identify areas to support. 28 students participated. The primary teacher interviewed the students and parents filled in a questionnaire. Results were in 3 categories, Vulnerable, At Risk or On Track.

RRS Results 2022-23

Physical Health and Well being: 3.6% At Risk / 96.4% On Track Social Competence: 7.1% Vulnerable / 14.3% At Risk / 78.6% On Track Emotional Maturity: 4% Vulnerable / 21.4% At Risk / 75% On Track Language and Cognitive Development: 100% On Track Communication Skill and General Knowledge: 7.1% At Risk, / 92. 9% On Track
